10 2013 Twin **Cities Open Championships**

Another well run, well-organized Dancer's Cup Tour event took place in Minneapolis this past July 10-13. The Twin Cities Open Ballroom Championships, the fifth stop on the tour was an exciting, hotly contested weekend. There were over 6,000 entries and a full ballroom every day. Heavy competition in both American Smooth and Rhythm made for twelve-hour matinee sessions. Louis Bar danced over 700 entries and was crisp and energetic each time he was on the floor. There were many Pro/Am men competitors this year and as

a result five of the ten Top Teacher awards went to female instructors!

A friendly, courteous atmosphere was felt throughout the weekend Scott and Amy thanks to Anderson's hospitality and experience as organizers. Scott was always present to handle any requests and was handing out home baked cookies to all. This is a long-standing "TCO" tradition! Downtown Minneapolis was such a treat for all the "out of towners" especially the ones escaping extreme heat almost everywhere else in the country.
